The Board of Education of the Hitchcock County Schools met June 8, 2015 at the Hitchcock County Junior/Senior High School in Trenton. Present were board members Rippen, Matson, Scott, Baker, Kolbet, and Marks. Also present were Superintendent Apple, Principal, Kershaw, the Hitchcock County News, Peggy Fyn, and several patrons.

President Matson called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Notice of the board's adherence to the Nebraska Open Meetings Law posted on the north wall of the meeting room was given.

Moved by Baker, seconded by Kolbet to approve the June, 2015 Regular Meeting Agenda with action item 7, cross country discussion, moved up to action item 2. Aye votes Baker, Kolbet, Marks, Scott, Matson, and Rippen; nay votes none.

President Matson welcomed visitors. A. Mote, S. Carfield, and W. Fritsch addressed the board.

Moved by Rippen; seconded by Scott to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Aye votes Rippen, Baker, Kolbet, Marks, Scott, and Matson; nay votes none. The consent agenda consisted of the following items: (1) Minutes of the May 2015 regular board meeting. (2) The Activity Fund. (3) The bill rosters with general fund bills totaling \$282,142.20 and lunch fund bills totaling \$10,442.93. (4) Other funds.

Administration and the board have been approached about adding Cross Country to Hitchcock County Schools sports. After consulting with the athletic director about scheduling meets, coaching, and NSAA rules, board members agreed that cross country would be a great opportunity for students. Moved by Rippen, seconded by Baker to offer cross country to Hitchcock County Schools' students. Aye votes Kolbet, Rippen, Marks, Scott, Matson, and Baker; nay votes none.

David Wimer presented the board with a handout of the school's transportation fleet and mileage. Mr. Wimer recommended retiring the blue suburban and the 2001 International bus. The board instructed Mr. Wimer to get bids on a bus.

Moved by Rippen; seconded by Scott to not raise 2015-2016 lunch prices. Aye votes Matson, Rippen, Baker, Kolbet, Marks, and Scott; nay votes none. Lunches will remain at \$2.50 for Pre-K through 6th grade, and \$2.70 for 7th grade through 12th grade. Adult lunches are \$3.25. Breakfasts for Pre-K through 12th grade are \$1.05. Adult breakfasts are \$1.25.

Superintendent Apple reviewed changes to the parent-student handbook. Moved by Rippen; seconded by Kolbet to approve the Parent-Student Handbook for the 2015-2016 school year as presented with noted changes. Aye votes Scott, Matson, Rippen, Baker, Kolbet, and Marks; nay votes none.

Moved by Scott; seconded by Rippen to accept board policy 4000's, 4001 through 4018, as presented. Aye votes Marks, Scott, Matson, Rippen, Baker, and Kolbet; nay votes none.

Mr. Kershaw presented the board with the number of home games in football, volleyball, basketball, and track meets. Moved by Scott; seconded by Baker to set the 2015-2016 Activity Passes at current levels. Aye votes Kolbet, Marks, Scott, Matson, Rippen, and Baker; nay votes none. Activity pass prices are \$100 per family; \$50.00 for a single adult; and \$20 for a student.

Board member Rippen gave a report on the Law Seminar he attended. He noted several legislative bills that will affect the district; going paperless for board meetings; affordable health care information, civil rights – Title 9, suicide prevention training for all staff.

Board member Baker reported that he, Scott, and Kolbet, and teachers met to discuss the year-end survey for board members and administration.

Principal Kershaw's report as follows: (1) A Certificate of Achievement from IXL was received for outstanding completion of 90,000 math problems. (2) Thank you to Matt Schnert and Schnert's Bakery; to McCook National Bank; and to the YMCA for the field trips taken in May. (3) The track is poured and being painted. (4) Elementary

PBiS training was in Lincoln June $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$. The elementary team has come up with an action plan for the 2015-16 school year. (5) The PLC training in San Antonio is June $16^{th} - 19^{th}$.

Superintendent Apples report as follows: (1) Supplies for the 2015-16 school year are coming in on a daily basis. (2) Tile removal in the gym and cafeteria is starting. (3) Drainage proposal bids are to be in by July 3^{rd} . (4) New teachers have been coming in and getting their rooms ready for the upcoming school year. (5) The PBiS trip to Denver was enjoyed by all.

President Matson adjourned the meeting at 7:58 PM. The next board meeting will be held on July 13, 2015 at 7:00 PM, at the Hitchcock County Junior/Senior High School. The agenda kept continuously current is available to the public in the school office during normal hours. The board may modify the agenda within 24 hours of the meeting for items of an emergency nature. The meeting is open to the public.
